Auditing – Megan Hayes PER

Quarterly Financial Reconciliations due: All Central District Committees with funds need to email VP Dan and myself their quarterly financial reconciliation of all funds, including all cash in the custody of that committee. The report is due by March 15th but the earlier the better (this includes bank statements from December 2025, January 2026 and February 2026).

Contracting Accountant now for Year-End - The fiscal year end is less than a month away and so engaging your Lodge accountant now for your year-end tax filings is a good idea. The Lodge Auditing and Accounting Committee should discuss with prospective accountants the requirements and proposed terms of the engagement. The “Employment of Accountant Contract” found in Appendix D of the Auditing and Accounting Manual (pages 119 & 120) needs to be completed. Inform the accountant when you will provide the books which should be no later than April 30th and that the accountant is aware that copies of the completed tax forms should be returned to you by June 15th. This allows the information to be presented to the lodge at the last monthly meeting in June and tax forms to be uploaded to the GL Auditing and Accounting Committee for review by the August 1st deadline. I know it seems like a long way off, but starting now will make meeting these deadlines much easier and help lodges avoid possible fines for being late.

Next Year’s Budget - It’s time to start preparing a budget for the 2026-27 Fraternal Year. Grand Lodge Statutes Section 12.070 require a budget be prepared (by the Board of Directors or Board of Trustees) for every entity of the lodge including Restricted Fund activities and presented to the lodge for approval no later than the final regular lodge meeting in April. A budget is most effective when actual revenue and expenses are compared to the budgeted amounts periodically during the year and management decisions are made to adjust operations as needed. This enables the lodge to manage its operations to attain a profit sufficient to finance the lodge’s fraternal and charitable objectives, to provide for growth and prevent year-end losses.

FRS Reporting - Just a reminder, the monthly FRS Report is due by the third Friday of every month.

Secretaries, we're coming to the end of the fraternal year and you should again reach out to your lapsed members asking them to pay their dues. It's also a good idea to ask if they need our help.

Also, per Grand Lodge Statute 14.160, any time during the month of February each year, the Secretary shall give notice informing the member(s) that they may be dropped if dues are not paid within 30 days of mailing the notice. You must post a list of all members given notice on the Lodge bulletin board and report the posting of the list at the next Lodge meeting. **Please read the entire statute to ensure compliance.** Effective date for dropping the member shall be not later than March 31st. Members cannot be dropped on April 1st with an effective date of March 31st since that will create an out of balance issue.

However, we need to do better and have 100% of Central District lodges sending students along with lodge advisors!

The DAP Poster, Essay and Video submissions were judged at the Peer Leadership Conference. Unfortunately our three entries for each category did not win. However, I was very excited that we had four lodges submit entries this year. Again, it would be nice if we had 100% participation! We also had two video entries this year and for as long as I can remember, we never have had any videos submitted. Kudos to Carteret and East Brunswick for submitting them. Ongoing thanks to Carteret Lodge Chair, Anne Marchitelli, as they have consistently submitting contest entries for many years! Thanks also to Edison and South Amboy for their entries!

All DAP Lodge Chairpersons should be strategizing on fundraising for the Walk Out on Drugs and begin their fundraising. I ask all incoming Exalted Rulers to personally check with them and see if they can assist in reaching the goal of donating \$1,000. Last year five of our lodges stepped up and reached the goal. 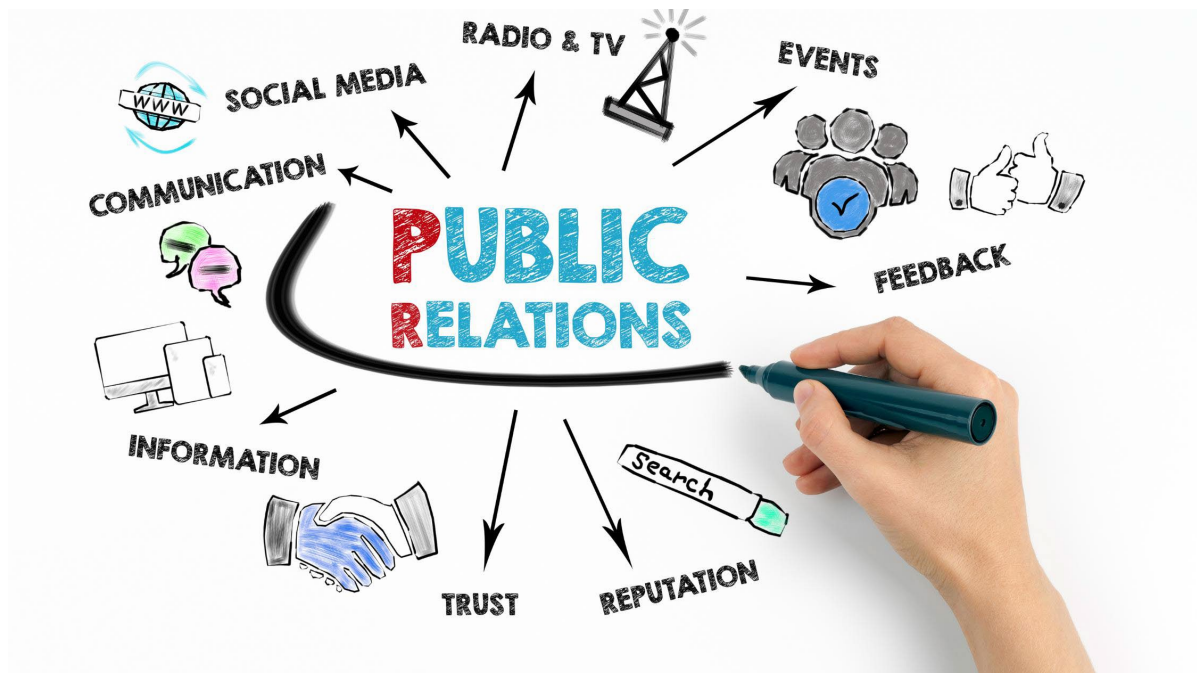

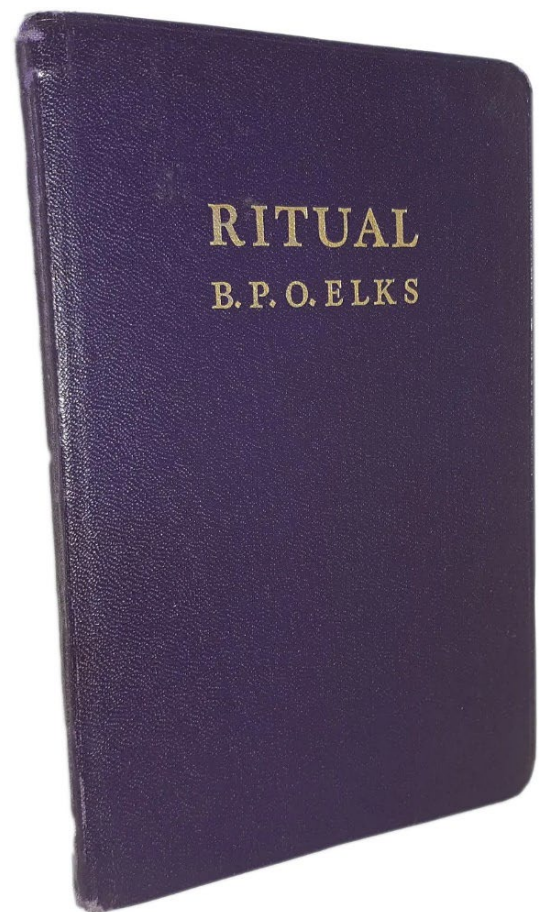

Scholarship – Jerry Mercado PER

New Jersey Elks Scholarship Opportunities – 2026

The New Jersey Elks are proud to support students across the state through several scholarship programs. Below are details for the 2026 awards cycle.

Most Valuable Student Scholarship (MVS)

The top 24 applicants from New Jersey advance to the national level of judging and are guaranteed a minimum \$4,000 scholarship (\$1,000 per year for four years). Students selected to attend the Leadership Weekend may receive even larger awards.

An additional 96 runners-up will receive a one-time \$700 scholarship from the NJ State Elks Association. The 2026 contest has concluded. Winners will be announced in late March 2026.

Elks Foundation Legacy Awards

Legacy Awards provide \$4,000 scholarships (\$1,000 per year for four years) to children and grandchildren (including stepchildren and step-grandchildren) of Elks members.

New Jersey families are eligible for at least 10 awards.

The application deadline was February 2, 2026. Winners will be announced in April 2026.

NJ Elks Vocational Scholarship

Each year, two \$1,000 vocational scholarships (one male and one female) are awarded in each of New Jersey's 12 Elks Districts — totaling \$24,000 in scholarships statewide.

Eligibility:

- Graduating high school seniors or students within four years of earning a high school diploma or GED
- Must be a U.S. citizen
- Must be a New Jersey resident at the time of application

Applications must be submitted to the student's local Elks Lodge and postmarked between March 5, 2026 and May 12, 2026.

New Jersey Elks Family Scholarship

These \$900 scholarships are available to children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren (including step-relatives) of New Jersey Elks members.

Eligible applicants:

- High school seniors
- College freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Students are encouraged to apply each year they are eligible.

Applications for the 2026 contest will be available online beginning April 15, 2026 and must be submitted by June 30, 2026.
